CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

Class A

Two vases each of five blooms, LARGE and/or MEDIUM FLOWERED, two cultivars, a different cultivar in each vase. The winner of this class will be awarded THE CHESSINGTON CUP presented by the late J. Collins Esq.

Class B

Four vases each of three blooms, A MINIMUM OF THREE CULTIVARS, a distinct cultivar in each vase. The winner of this class will be awarded THE RENE SMITH TROPHY presented by R.P. Smith Esq.

Class C

Five vases each of five stems, POMPON and/or SPRAYS. A MINIMUM OF THREE CULTIVARS, a distinct cultivar in each vase. The winner of this class will be awarded THE FLO NICHOLSON TROPHY presented by S.H. Nicholson Esq. and the late Mrs F. Nicholson.

Prizes for classes A, B and C: 1st £10 2nd £5 3rd £2.50

MEMBERS CLASSES

A TANKARD presented by D.J. Pierce Esq. will be awarded to the best vase in this section.

8. One vase, five blooms, MEDIUM or SMALL FLOWERED.
9. One vase, five blooms, TWO OR MORE DIFFERENT CULTIVARS.
10. One vase, three blooms, ANY COLOUR, ONE CULTIVAR.
11. One vase, POMPON and/or SPRAYS.
12. One vase of five stems, POMPON and/or SPRAYS, ONE CULTIVAR.
13. One vase of five stems, POMPON and/or SPRAYS, DOUBLE Variety, One CULTIVAR.
14. One BASKET or CONTAINER of Chrysanthemums, displayed for affect. Space for exhibit two feet by two feet.
15. NOVICE CLASS. One vase, three blooms/stems ANY CLASSIFICATION.

A NOVICE for the purpose of this Society is one who is deemed to have never won a FIRST prize in any class held under NCS and NDS rules in any previous season at Surrey Chrysanthemum and Dahlia Society.

No one variety to be used for more than one classification sub-group.

A distinct variety in each vase

Four different classes of dahlias from any of the following:-

THREE BLOOMS GIANT (can be staged in separate vases)

THREE BLOOMS LARGE

THREE BLOOMS MEDIUM DECORATIVE

THREE BLOOMS MEDIUM CACTUS or SEMI CACTUS

FIVE BLOOMS SMALL or MINIATURE DECORATIVE

FIVE BLOOMS SMALL or MINIATURE CACTUS or SEMI CACTUS

FIVE BLOOMS SMALL or MINIATURE BALL

SIX BLOOMS POMPON or FIVE BLOOMS LARGE POMPON

The winner will be awarded THE CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL TROPHY.

SURREY SMALL GROWERS CHAMPIONSHIP

Restricted to exhibitors growing fewer than 200 plants

Four vases, three blooms in each from AT LEAST TWO CLASSIFICATION GROUPS OR SUB-GROUPS. A distinct cultivar in each vase. No one cultivar to be used more than once.

The winner will be awarded THE DUNBAR TROPHY presented by Mrs D. Dunbar.

Prizes for Surrey Small Growers Championship: 1st £10 2nd £5 3rd £2.50

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

Class A

Six blooms GIANT in separate vases. The winner of this class will be awarded THE HAMARI TROPHY presented by the late W. Ensum Esq.

Class B

Two vases, three blooms in each vase LARGE. (Excluding LARGE POMPON) The winner of this class will be awarded THE MORDEN TROPHY presented by the late E.F. Jefferies Esq. and the late E. Palmer Esq.

Class C

Three vases, three blooms in each vase MEDIUM. The winner of this class will be awarded THE CARLSHALTON CUP presented by E.J. Reeves Esq.

Class D

Two vases, five blooms in each vase SMALL. A different cultivar in each vase. The winner of this class will be awarded THE CROYDON CUP presented by the late K. Letts Esq.

Class E

Two vases, five blooms in each vase MINIATURE. A different cultivar in each vase. The winner of this class will be awarded THE AGNES FRANKLIN CUP presented by W. Franklin Esq.

Class F

Three vases, six blooms in each, POMPON. Two or more cultivars, a distinct cultivar in each vase. The winner of this class will be awarded THE SHIRLEY POM CUP presented by Mr & Mrs W.W. Clark

Prizes for classes A,B,C,D,E & F 1st £10 2nd £5 3rd £2.50

Section B

16. Three blooms GIANT. May be staged in separate vases.
17. Three blooms LARGE. May be staged in separate vases.
18. Two vases, three blooms in each, MEDIUM.
19. Three vases, three blooms in each, SMALL and/or MINIATURE, one cultivar in each vase.
20. Two vases, six blooms in each vase, POMPON.
21. Two vases, five blooms in each vase, COLLERETTE
22. Two vases, five blooms in each vase, WATERLILY.
23. A 10 inch BOWL supplied by the Society containing DAHLIAS.
Minimum number of blooms 12. Judged in accordance with N.D.S. guidelines. Dahlia foliage only allowed. Size limits on blooms will not apply. Maximum width two feet six inches.

Section C

24. Three vases, A DISTINCT VARIETY IN EACH comprising of:-

One vase, three blooms MEDIUM

One vase, five blooms SMALL

One vase, five blooms MINIATURE or six blooms POMPON

This class is restricted to exhibitors growing fewer than 200 plants.

The winner of this class will be awarded THE WORCESTER PARK CUP which was won outright in 1975 by the late K.F. Letts Esq. who kindly presented the cup to the Society for perpetual competition.

25. One bloom, GIANT or LARGE.

26. One bloom, MEDIUM or SMALL.

27. ONE vase, three blooms MEDIUM DECORATIVE.

28. One vase, three blooms, SMALL DECORATIVE.

29. One vase, three blooms, MEDIUM CACTUS and/or SEMI CACTUS.

30. One vase, three blooms, SMALL CACTUS and/or SEMI CACTUS.

31. One vase, three blooms, SMALL or MINIATURE BALL.

32. One vase, three blooms, MINIATURE DECORATIVE.

33. One vase, three blooms, MINIATURE CACTUS or SEMI CACTUS.

34. One vase, six blooms POMPON.

35. One vase, three blooms, WATERLILY.

36. One vase, three blooms, COLLERETTE.

37. Two vases, three blooms in each, SMALL and/or MINIATURE and/or POMPON one classification in each vase.

38. One vase, three blooms, Bi-COLOURED any classification.

39. Three vases, ONE BLOOM IN EACH, three distinct cultivars from a different group or sub group.

40. Two vases, three blooms in each, SIX DISTINCT VARIETIES.

41. One DAHLIA bloom in 8 x6 inch FRAME (Frame supplied by Society). Only Dahlia foliage allowed which must be contained within frame, size limits on bloom will not apply.

42. NOVICE CLASS – one vase, three blooms, ANY CLASSIFICATION.

A Novice for the purpose of this Society is one who is deemed to have never won a first prize in any class held under NCS and NDS rules in any previous season at Surrey Chrysanthemum and Dahlia Society.
